#### HASHTAG BASICS

- Use 25 to 30 tags per post.
- Use less than 5 tags with 1 million + uses.
- Use 10-20 tags with 1k to 50k uses.
- Use 5 to 10 tags with 50k to 500k uses.
- Use 1 or 2 branded tags of your making.
- Always post tags in your caption.

#### LARGE TAGS (1 MIL +)

What kind of art do you create? (Abstract, Expressionism, Fluid Art, etc.) Start here for your large tags, but be as specific as you can. Start searching Instagram.

#### MEDIUM TAGS (50K TO 500K)

If you run out of tag ideas, answer the questions below and find other tags that relate through searching Instagram.

Brainstorm key words and see where they lead.

- What art supplies do you use?
- What kind of techniques do you use?
- Where do you sell? Etsy, galleries, art fairs, Society6, etc.
- · What colors do you use?
- What kind of house would your art fit into?
- What kind of artist are you? Wild spirit, bold, mathematical, expressive, energetic, etc.
